God is powerful and can always help me.






What do you do when you are hungry? What do you do when you are thirsty? Let's listen to find out what one man did when he was very hungry and thirsty.




There was no rain for a long, LONG time, just as God had said. God told His helper Elijah to stay by a little stream, so he would have **water** to drink every day.

"Don't worry," Elijah said kindly. "God has promised that there will be enough **food** for us all."


The woman baked the bread for Elijah. Then she went to the jar where she kept her flour. There was still flour in the jar!




