“No, I can’t,” Joseph said. “But God will help me know what your dream means.” So Pharaoh told Joseph his dream.

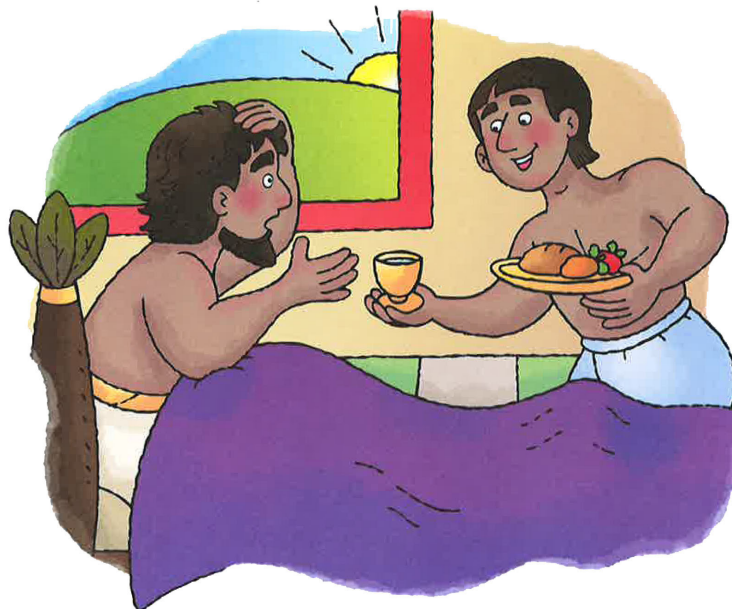


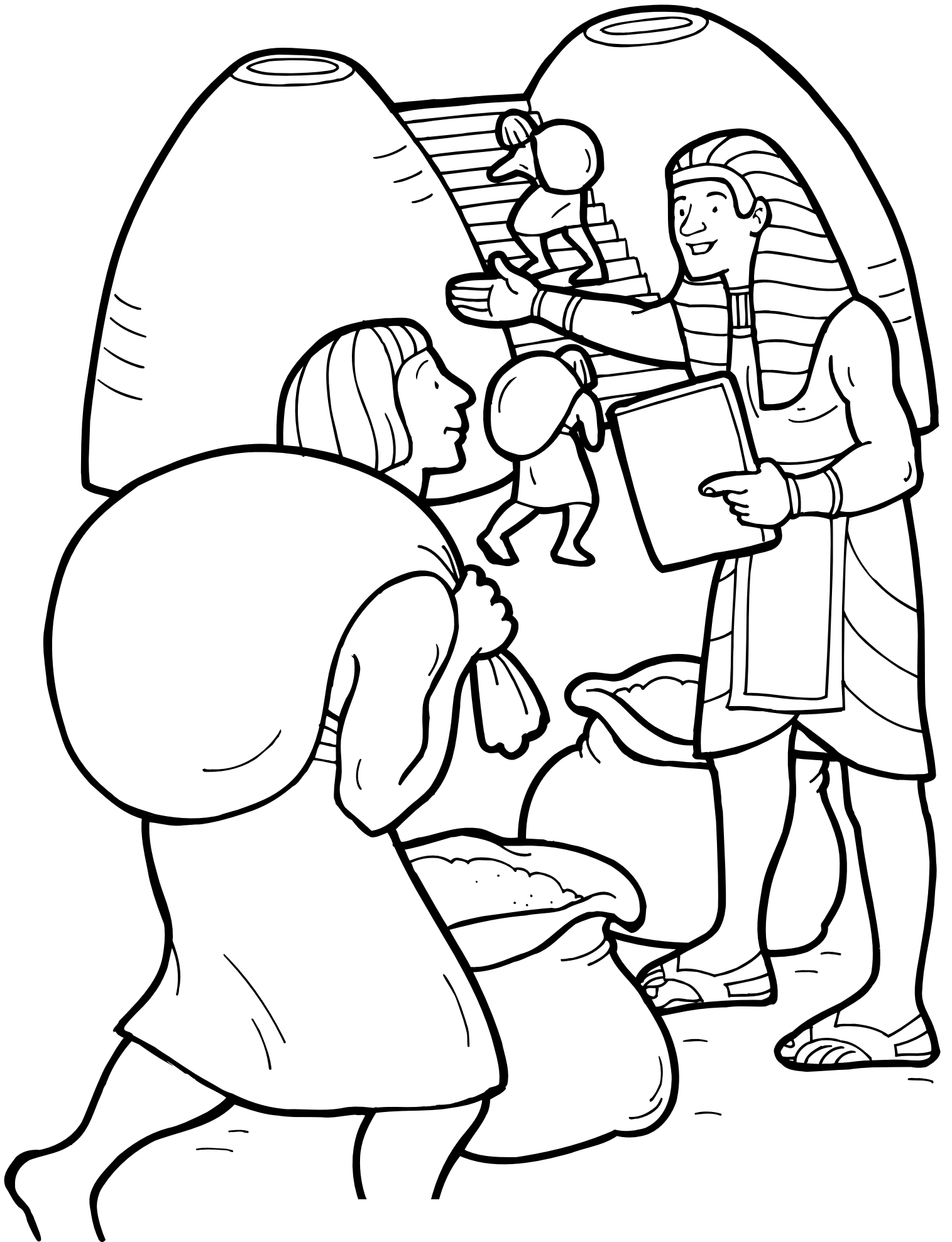

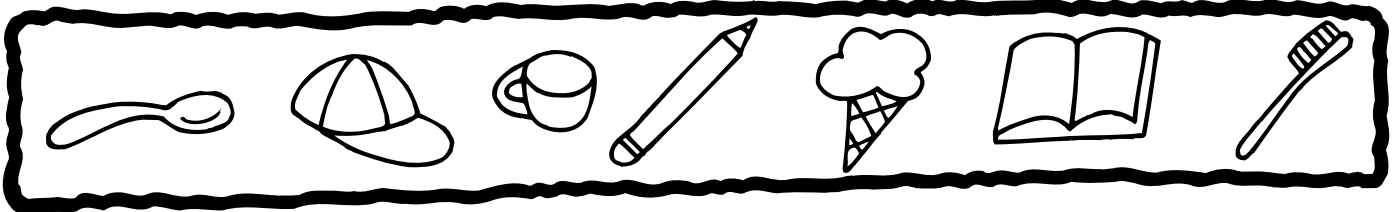
Pharaoh told Joseph, “Since God helped you know what my dream meant, I want you to make sure that the extra food is saved.”
